

NSW Department of Education and Communities ITINERANT SUPPORT SERVICE FOR CHILDREN WITH A HEARING IMPAIRMENT

Provides support for families with children, who are Deaf or hearing impaired, who meet the Department of Education and Communities Disability Criteria.

Our service can be delivered in a registered preschool setting, a mainstream school, a support class or special school depending on individual educational needs.

Support for these students and their families is currently available from time of diagnosis through to Year 12, by Itinerant Support Teachers Hearing (ISTH).



An Individual Education Program is developed for each child in collaboration with the parents and other professionals and implemented in a number of ways:

- Programs to teach speech and language through listening and when needed, through signed communication and augmentative communication strategies.
- Assisting families and schools with ideas and strategies to incorporate language and speech goals into everyday situations.
- Assisting with audiological management
- Liaising with personnel in educational settings

Successful outcomes for children who are Deaf or hearing impaired are achieved through a collaborative partnership between the student, the family, the school and the ISTH.

- the child's parent or carer
- professionals with the permission of the child's parent or carer.
